Description of major:

Acquaintance with a foreign language and a foreign culture has a profound effect on the way individuals view their own language and their own heritage. Studying a foreign language will help students to understand a more global perspective and understanding of all humanity. Students deepen their backgrounds in the humanities while acquiring a working knowledge of another language, which is a practical skill, valued in many of today's professions. Students majoring in a foreign language are encouraged to develop a complementary skill. Few jobs requiring foreign language proficiency require only skill in a foreign language. Foreign language majors are strongly encouraged to study abroad.
