THE PRELUDE:

The Procession shall begin at the Gospel side of the Chancel, outside the walls, proceed along the north pavement to the West, and complete the encirclement of the Chapel by crossing to the South Promenade, and then shall enter the Chapel through the Gloria Christi Chapel beneath the Chancel. When the Procession enters the Memorial Chapel, the congregation shall rise and sing

Almighty and Eternal God, the Sanctifier of all things, Whose loving kindness never faileth, Who rulest both in heaven and in earth, keeping mercy for Thy people who walk before the presence of Thy glory: graciously vouchsafe Thy presence as we dedicate this building to Thy most holy worship and service; mercifully illumine and brighten it with Thine own glory, and pour down Thy blessing upon it; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord.

And the Congregation shall say:

of this University, I deliver to you the keys thereof, and pray you now to dedicate it to
the worship of the Triune God.

Then shall the President of the University say:

In the name of the Board of Trustees and the Faculties of this University we
accept the keys, in token of the trust committed to us. We are ready to proceed to the
Dedication.

*The Procession shall then enter the Chapel, the Choir and the Congregation resuming

The Sermon ended, the Congregation shall rise, and the Officiant shall say

THE PRAYER OF DEDICATION

O Eternal God, Whom the heaven of heavens can not contain, but Who dost graciously manifest Thyself to Thy people who assemble in Thy name: vouchsafe to be present with us who are here gathered together to dedicate this House to Thy Glory. Be with us as we set it apart to Thy service, for the offering to Thee of the sacrifices of prayer and praise, for the reading and preaching of Thy holy Word, for the celebration of Thy holy Sacraments, for the blessing of Thy people in Thy name, and for all

other sacred ordinances. Accept, we beseech Thee, this willing service which we bring Thee in gratitude for Thy goodness to this University through the century past, and grant that this House may be an habitation of Thy glory now and in years to come, that all who seek Thy presence here may behold Thine everlasting light, and be satisfied with Thine eternal love; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord.

And the Congregation shall say:

Amen.

Then shall follow

The Order of the Dedication of the Louis G. Nuechterlein Memorial Pulpit

The Officiant: Our help is in the name of the Lord:

The Congregation: Who made heaven and earth.

The Officiant: How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the Gospel of peace.

The Congregation: And bring glad tidings of good things.

The Officiant: Their sound went into all the earth: and their words unto the end of the world.

The Congregation: Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life.

Then shall the Officiant say:

O God, Who dost enlighten the minds of Thy servants with the knowledge of Thy Truth: Bless, we beseech Thee, this Memorial Pulpit, and give unto those who shall stand therein the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord, so that they may speak those things which belong unto eternal life as Thou hast revealed them in Thy Son Who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

The Officiant: Praise Him upon the loud cymbals: praise Him upon the high sounding cymbals.

The Congregation: Let everything that hath breath praise the Lord. Praise ye the Lord.

The Officiant: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost:
