This year the target goal for SALT's campaign will be \$14,000. Exemplify how the proposed project is targeted at establishing social justice, equal justice, rights, or opportunities. This should be answered in two sentences.

Please attach a project proposal to the application that covers the following areas:

- 1) **Organizational Information** (i.e. mission statement, history, current work, and scope). *Help SALT understand who you are as an organization and what you are doing to promote social justice for our global community in order to determine the feasibility of promoting your organization's project on campus.*
- 2) **A detailed budget of proposed expenses.** *Demonstrate how the World Relief Campaign funds will be used carefully and wisely. Budgets that use funds for sustainable materials and which channel funds directly to the people affected are preferred – for example, a project that funds significant administrative costs will be considered weaker.*
- 3) **How the project will remain of service after the money has been utilized.** *Explain the project's level of sustainability. We look for projects that tap into local and existing resources (both material and human) in a way that is repeatable. On a basic level, an indicator of sustainability is that a project will not need to apply for grants the next year with the same exact application. We also focus on projects in which the one time gift will be able to cover all expenses of the proposed project.*
- 4) **How your organization has taken into account the goals and ideas of the people affected by your project in its design.** *Do the people the project will be serving need and want it? Does the project engage and involve community members – both in the development of the project proposal and the implementation of the project?*
- 5) **How you see this project fitting into SALT's mission statement:** *SALT is the social justice ministry of the Chapel of the Resurrection at Valparaiso University. As a community, students seek to embody the Christian call to be the "salt of the earth" (Matt 5:13). SALTERs are equipped to lead lives of social justice and serve as agents for positive change in their communities.*
