## Students travel to Japan for VU Class

Students enrolled in Cultural Memory in Japan had an opportunity for hands on experience with Japanese culture by spending their spring break in Japan. Under the instruction of Prof. Jennifer Prough (Christ College), 7 undergraduate students and 1 graduate student travelled to Kyoto, Japan at the beginning of March. Each student had an individual research project which they were researching during the trip, such as The Contemporary Japanese Family, the Emperor in the Twentieth Century, Samurai Spirit and World War II, among others. In addition, Prof. George Pati, from Theology Department, also attended the trip in order to enrich his course on East Asian Religions.

Thanks to a 7-day Japan Railways pass, the group was able to enjoy daytrips to Hiroshima, Himeji, and Tokyo, on the Shinkansen (Bullet Train). The class was able to travel to various famous places such as the atomic bomb dome, Peace Park, the Itsukushima shrine, Harajuku, Himeji Castle, among others.

In addition to the above mentioned places, the class also traveled to several cities near Kyoto. Among a

few places was Kansai Gaidai University, with which VU has an exchange program. Former Valparaiso University exchange students, Chiaki Ishihara and Ayako Naito, assisted the class in some of their excursions, as did current exchange student, Kaori Naka. Additionally, Kansai Gaidai University students also volunteered their time during the weekend to escort and translate for the class. Ken Takehura, one of our translators, will be studying abroad at VU in the upcoming school year.

The class will be featuring their photos in a photography exhibit in the Mueller Hall Gallery from April 12<sup>th</sup> - June 30<sup>th</sup>. All are welcome to attend the opening reception which will occur on April 19<sup>th</sup> from 3:30 - 4:30 PM in the Christ College Commons, to be followed by the Japanese Club Curry Dinner. The opening reception is free to all, and the curry dinner tickets will be on sale, at a nominal fee, from the Union Information Desk.

All in all, the trip was an educational experience and unique opportunity for students of VU. The CJS Program at VU offers similar research trips to China or Japan on a yearly basis.
