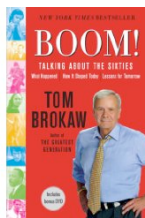




# Books & Coffee 2009

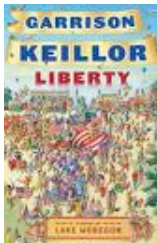

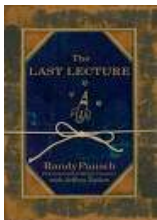

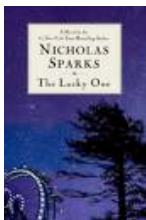
