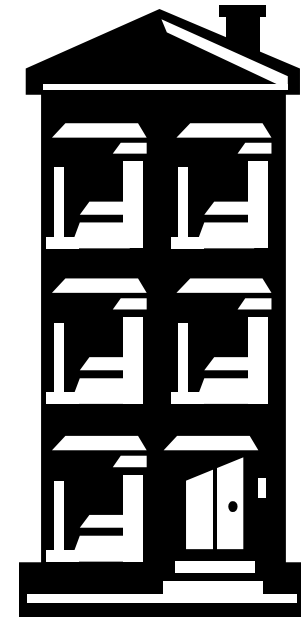

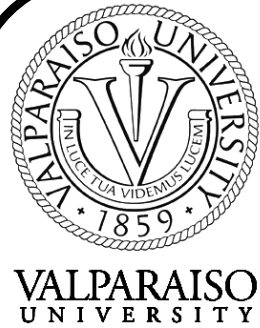

- Live “off campus” as early as your Sophomore year.
- Enjoy all the amenities of this unique off-campus, apartment-style residence.

## REQUIREMENTS

- Any student who is taking or has taken French 204 or the equivalent can apply for residence during their sophomore, junior, or senior year.
- Applications will be accepted from any student, regardless of major. International students whose native language is French will be considered if space is available.
- Applications are reviewed by a committee of faculty and staff. Decisions are made based on GPA, language ability and willingness to participate in communal life. Seniority and gender balance are also considered.
- Applicants are informed whether or not they have been selected well in advance of the campus-wide room selection process.

## STUDY ABROAD

Students who are studying abroad are especially encouraged to apply to live in the French House — either in preparation for their time abroad or as a way of easing back into American campus life after being abroad.

To accommodate students who study abroad, it is indeed possible to apply to live in the French House for only one semester.

It is important to investigate early how study abroad and French House residency can fit in with your academic program.
