

Course Statistics

Course Statistics need to be enabled before they can be tracked within CourseVU. To accomplish this, the “Track number of views” setting should be set to “Yes” when you are creating content within the Control Panel. Each time you add a new piece of content you wish to track, you should enable this setting. See the figure below for example.

- A) Select which report you would like to use: Overall Summary, Access by Content, Group or Forum
- B) Use the Time Period selection area to narrow or broaden your report times. This could be useful for a specific period around a quiz or test
- C) You are given the option to chose all students in the course or selected ones. Use your control key and click on each name you want to search for if it is more than one.

This is a good example of statistics from a course. You can see the breakdown of how many hits or visits to a specific area that a student has been to. A percentage will give you a simple overview of the amount of time they are spending an area versus other areas of the course. Using this information, you can structure your course to fit how the student wants to visit CourseVU. A graph gives you a visual that can be quickly viewed for course information.
