# ***What is distinctive about a U.S. education?***

- **Favors creative and independent thinking over rote learning and memorization**
- **Favors broad learning across many subjects before specialization**
- **Focuses on life-long skills like communication, investigation, and analysis**
- **Valued by employers all over the world**

# ***Research 1 University Compared to Valpo***

- **Internationally it might be better known**
- **Emphasis would be on the research agenda of the professor**
- **Student learning would not be as emphasized as it is at Valpo**
- **This is what one would get at a big university:**
  - **Large classes**
  - **Often taught by graduate students**
  - **Little emphasis on critical thinking and writing skills**

# ***Valpo: A Comprehensive University and a Unique Model of American Education***

- **Small like many liberal arts colleges**
- **Emphasis on undergraduate and masters level education and professional doctorates like DNP and JD**
- **Multiple colleges, e.g., business, engineering, nursing, arts, humanities—thus *comprehensive*.**
- **Provides the best of both large universities and liberal arts colleges**

- **As a private, small, elite university, Valpo offers:**
  - **Small classes**
  - **Strong faculty/student interaction and mentoring**
  - **Integrated learning**

# Why Valparaiso University?



# **In its 150-year history, Valpo has passed through three distinct phases.**

- **Begun by Methodists in 1859 as an institution pioneering coeducation**
- **It was revived in 1873 by an enterprising educator, Henry Baker Brown, as the Northern Indiana Normal School, renamed Valparaiso College in 1900, and rechartered in 1906 as Valparaiso University. During the next 20 years it won national recognition as a low-cost, no frills institution of higher learning.**
- **The modern era in University history began in 1925 with purchase of the institution by the Lutheran University Association. Hereafter, the university has grown dramatically in academic quality and has achieved considerable recognition.**




## Recognitions & Rankings (continued)



- **More than 220 full-time faculty, approximately 90% of whom hold Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.**


