

Assistant Professor in Theatrical Design and Technology

The Department of Theatre at Valparaiso University invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position at the level of Assistant Professor, in Theatrical Design and Technology, with a primary specialization in set design and technology, and secondary specialization in lighting. Position begins August 1, 2016.

The successful candidate has had production experience in both professional and academic settings. S/he will be experienced in successful collaboration and problem-solving, able to work effectively with faculty, staff, students, and guest artists in the development of artistically and educationally successful shows. Key responsibilities will include 1) design and oversee construction of sets and lights for four theatre productions and one dance concert each year, 2) teach core theatre curriculum in Basic Stagecraft, Scenery and Lighting, Introduction to Theatre, and 3) as the technical director, this individual will select and manage student assistants and oversee day to day operations in the scene shop. The curriculum also provides opportunities to develop courses in areas of specialization. Experience facilitating production processes and managing budgets is highly desirable.

Qualifications: MFA or MFA/PhD in Scenic Design/Theatre Technology and with significant demonstrated experience in lighting design.
