### Break Housing

As Thanksgiving break quickly approaches, you may wonder if you qualify for break housing. Below are the criteria for students wishing to apply:

1. You are an International or Interlink student.
2. You are a VU student athlete in mid-season with practice and/or games over break.
3. You are a student participating in a credit-bearing activity such as student teaching, internship, or co-op.
4. You live 500 miles or more away from your permanent address.

If you qualify, please go to [www.valpo.edu/reslife](http://www.valpo.edu/reslife) and fill out our Thanksgiving Holiday Break Housing form. You can also pick up and fill out a paper form from our office in 250 Harre Union - this must be complete by **5pm on Wednesday, November 9, 2011**. Our break housing buildings are Brandt, Wehrenberg, and Uptown East - if you do not live in any of these buildings and need break housing, please find someone in these buildings who is willing to let you use the room, and have that information ready for the form you need to fill out. If you do not know anyone, there is a space on the form to indicate this.

**NOTE: Students ARE NOT automatically eligible for break housing if they hold an on or off campus job that is not directly associated with a credit-bearing academic program.**

The presentation will be in Spanish and Stuart will provide consecutive translation
