- 1. FORMAL CALL TO ORDER: 8:30pm
- 2. ROLL CALL: Excused absences: Senator Hertzberg, Senator Gautum, Senator Martin
- 3. GUEST SPEAKER: Provost Eric W. Johnson
 - a. Electrical engineering alumni from '87, Provost since last February
 - b. Currently searching for Deans for the college of engineering this fall and Christ College in the spring
 - c. All deans, student life department, and study abroad department reports to the Provost's office.
 - d. Main focus right now is increasing enrollment for both undergraduate and graduate students
 - i. Working on increase the number of online graduate students
 - e. Questions:
 - i. What is your vision for where the university is in 5 years with enrollment and programs?
 - 1. At least 3,000-3,500 undergraduate students and 700-750 graduate students. Currently, we are at 2,500 undergraduate students.
 - 2. Improved branding of our student activities and our campus.
 - 3. Students and student life is the focus.
 - 4. Additional facilities would be repurposed or established accordingly.
 - ii. How do you plan to rebrand programs when we have had several be cut in the last few years?
 - 1. We need to do a better job of marketing the program packages we can offer. For example, a meteorology major with a communications minor.
 - 2. Offer students on visits specific program combinations that fit with their career goals.
 - iii. How will tuition be impacted with an increase in enrollment?
 - 1. An increase in student enrollment does not mean an increase in tuition cost.
 - 2. Ideally, 500 more students paying the current tuition would be great.
 - iv. How are you working to address issues of accreditation when it comes to specific programs, such as bioengineering?
 - 1. The issue of accreditation will not be an issue in the future as it is currently being worked on.
 - 2. There is not a possibility of retroactive accreditation.
 - v. How is the enrollment of international students?
 - 1. The enrollment went down with COVID-19. We have had an increase in Indian students. We are going to work on marketing to international students better.
 - vi. What does the process for recruiting and maintaining faculty of color look like?
 - 1. There is a process set up to get a more diverse group of applicants and to eliminate biases.
 - 2. We do not currently have a lot of open positions but we are encouraging departments to increase the number of adjunct faculty of color that they have.

- vii. Do you have a plan for attracting more transfer and non-traditional students?
 - 1. I have visited 4-5 community colleges this fall. We are not very transfer friendly at this point.
 - 2. We are looking at degree completion opportunities and offering more night classes for non-traditional students.
- viii. What programs are you hoping to have the 500-1000 students additional students study?
 - 1. Currently the breakdown is 52% nursing, engineering, and business, and 48% arts and sciences.
 - 2. We don't have a preference for what programs.
- ix. How do you plan to attract more students?
 - 1. The biggest change is that we are planning on sending our acceptance letters out with our merit scholarships. We have several other policy shifts that impact visit days, how we do tours, etc. to get as many students on campus as possible.
- x. What do you think student senate can do?
 - 1. Continue to advocate for students and bring the issues that are important to students to the president and provost's office.
