GERMAN HOUSE INFORMATION

Eligibility

1. Applicants must have completed at least German 204 or the equivalent by the time residency begins. Freshmen are not eligible to live in the German House.
2. Applications are accepted from any student, regardless of major; international students whose native language is German will be considered if space is available. Students who are not German exchange students are expected to enroll in a German course each semester of residency.
3. A committee of faculty members (composed of the German faculty and former Reutlingen directors) makes the selections and room assignments. Selection is based on academic standing, German ability, and promise to contribute to the success of the German House community. The configuration of suites, which are always same-gender, may affect selection.

The Facility

The Kade-Duesenberg German House and Cultural Center is located at 822 Mound Street.

Student residential units, located on the second floor, are configured in suites. Three suites have two bedrooms and one bathroom; a fourth suite has one double room and a bathroom. Two rooms are singles. The facility is co-educational, but each suite houses either all women or all men. The native-speaker RA resides in a separate suite, also located on the second floor.

A great room with dining facilities and an adjacent kitchen are also located on the second floor. All residents participate Sunday through Thursday in a communal evening meal prepared by the residents. The residential floor also has laundry facilities, a small study/computer room, and a lounge.

The first floor of the facility houses a lobby and gallery space, a large conference room, a small seminar room (the "Library"), a dining servery, office space for the Director of the Kade-Duesenberg German House and Cultural Center, and a modest apartment for visiting scholars. A secure entry configuration ensures that visitors to the first floor do not have access to the second floor unless escorted by a resident.

Rules and Expectations

1. German House residents follow the same rules that govern other residence halls, particularly with regard to **alcohol and visitation**.
2. German House residents take **good care of the facility**, preserving the generous gifts of the Duesenbergs, Krefts, Giebels, and the Max Kade Foundation for generations of students to come.
3. German House residents **speak in German** with one another in all public areas of the German House. English may be used with non-German speaking guests, but should be restricted to the suite areas or to very specific times such as German Club meetings or special dinners with non-German speaking guests.
4. German House residents eat their **weekday evening meals** (Sunday - Thursday) together at the House with preparation, clean-up, and expense shared equally among the residents. Students will additionally purchase a meal card (which cost \$425 per semester in 2019-2020) to use for breakfast and/or lunch.
5. German House residents host and attend regular **German Club meetings**. They are encouraged to develop and participate in additional activities that include non-residents and that promote the use of German and knowledge of German culture.
6. German House residents regularly attend Kaffeestunde (schedule permitting) and other **German Program events**, augmenting their own learning and serving as an example to others.
