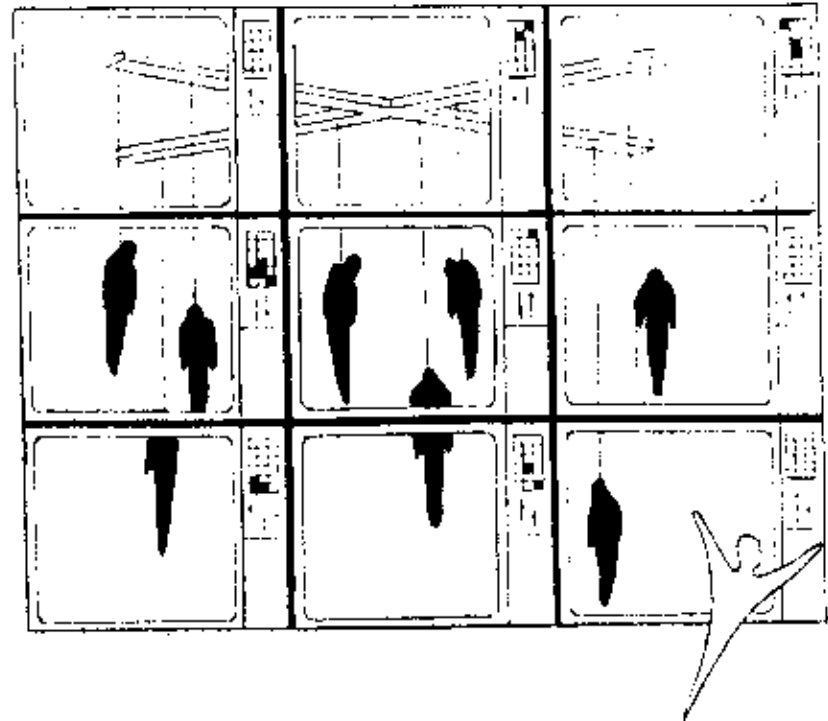

SUMMARY

"The Price Is Life" is the TV show's TV show, and its host, Simon Price, influences all aspects of society. Contestants attempt to earn a Certificate of Eternal Popularity by pleasing Simon. During the program, five gunmen burst into the studio, trying to permanently cancel the show. The motives of their leader, Daniel McReynolds, are explained in a series of flashbacks which end in his son's death.

The group begins to convince people that television stifles imagination, creativity and independence. But Melissa, a former contestant, argues that violent methods are not the solution. Suddenly, a group of local teenagers enter the studio to join Daniel, their new television idol. He loses control and shoots one teenager. Then he realizes that he is a product of what he is protesting. He leaves the studio and shoots himself.

Several days later, many people remain unaffected. In the end, however, a few are influenced by Daniel's arguments and become free-thinking individuals.

"The Price Is Life" is an entirely original production that is solely the effort of the Christ College Freshman Program of 1989-90. (C.E.) We, the students, brainstormed, originated, argued over and debated, always questioned, contemplated, changed, conceived and created, anguished over, loved and hated, choreographed, orchestrated, built, designed, organized, complimented, criticized, humored, sang, lyricized, painted, pondered, improvised, hashed, re-hashed, harmonized, sometimes trashed, publicized, composed, conducted, scripted, versed, practised often and rehearsed, filmed, designed, wrote, reversed, produced, performed, cast and cursed the ideas, characters, dialogue, scenery, music, action, and other aspects of this production.
