# Indiana Youth Programs on Campus (IYPC) Made possible by the Lilly Endowment

- Initiative designed to help Indiana colleges and universities in their efforts to create new or expand and enhance existing high-quality, on-campus programs for Indiana youth
- Ages 5 18
- Indiana public and private colleges and universities that have a physical campus in the state are eligible to participate
- The Endowment is allocating a total of \$28.8 million for planning grants and program implementation grants

## **Education in Indiana**

Colleges and universities across the nation are facing changing demographics and recent declines in the numbers of college-going students.

There has been a recent decline of college enrollment of Indiana's high school graduates.

2015

65% of high school graduates enrolled in a college or university

2019

59% of high school graduates enrolled in a college or university

Help address Indiana's unacceptably low rankings in the percentage of its adult population with a bachelor's degree or a meaningful postsecondary credential








### POLL Washington Post-Kaiser Family Foundation Poll


### Youth in Northwest Indiana live at an intersection:
