

Building Community Through Group Work I was fortunate to recently attend the Midwest Conference on

Scholarship in Teaching and Learning with a group of faculty members from Valpo. Many of the sessions focused on regaining student attention or reducing distractions. However, perhaps my favorite session was Engagement of Students and Teams: by Developing

Own Team Policies. This presentation dealt with how to encourage and support students in

By participating in the process, students were given latitude to figure out how their groups best functioned, set expectations, and hold each other accountable.

As someone who has taught using groups for years, I was a little embarrassed to have not

thought of this myself. I always thought of it as my responsibility to provide the accountability structure, instead of allowing students to generate their own best practice through community. This does not absolve an instructor from providing examples, guidance, and still stepping in when necessary. However, the approach can lead to a more cohesive bond between students participating in group work

Tools for Creating Fun and Productive Community


