Kappa Alpha Psi is a historically African American fraternity, and is in the process of selecting their founding class for the spring of 2018.



For many years, students at Valparaiso University have expressed interest in establishing a historically African American fraternity or sorority on campus. The vote to invite Kappa Alpha Psi to Valpo was unanimous among the Expansion Committee and the Interfraternity Council. All the new members of Kappa Alpha Psi will be officially announced at their new member show, which will be scheduled for May 2018. The men of the Ball State chapter are mentoring this new Kappa Alpha Psi chapter, and many Kappa Alpha Psi members from all over the region will be attending the new member show to honor the newest addition to their brotherhood.



The history of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. is filled with culture, lessons, and values that guide the men who join the fraternity. Kappa Alpha Psi was founded as Kappa Alpha Nu in 1911 at Indiana University in Bloomington. This was during a very tumultuous period, where black men often were not allowed to attend a university, let alone join a fraternity. Since that time, Kappa Alpha Psi has expanded into seven countries across the globe, has reached over 160,000 members all over the world, and continues to develop and increase their numbers today.

The establishment of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. at Valparaiso University marks the first National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC) fraternity to join the community. All of the current fraternities and sororities are excited to welcome this new group to campus. Valparaiso University prides itself on being a welcoming community, and the warm reception that the fraternity and sorority community has already shown is an example of the commitment to community at Valpo!
