Phi Kappa Psi Focuses on Service for Annual PhiPsi 500 Event

Choosing to emphasize community service for this year's event, the men of Phi Kappa Psi hosted their annual Phi Psi 500 in the form of a week-long service competition in partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of Valparaiso. All fraternity and sorority chapters were invited to participate, and the fraternity or sorority with the highest participation of average service hours for the week would be awarded \$500 to the philanthropy of their choice. The event took place during the week of October 23-27.

Participants were encouraged to participate in community service initiatives throughout the entire week, and chapters were asked to organize or continue their own service projects. Additional volunteer opportunities were provided throughout the week to participants at the Boys & Girls Club, where over 150 volunteers organized activities, helped with homework, and assisted with a fall festival and Halloween party.

The Phi Psi 500 Week of Service far surpassed its goal, with 195 participants from 14 organizations completing 773 hours of community service in one week. This estimated economic impact of this service is \$18,211 to the local Valparaiso community.

The women of Sigma Lambda Gamma won the competition with an average of 4.75 hours per member completed during the week. The men of Phi Kappa Psi look forward to growing the event, and are especially are eager to continue to develop a long-lasting relationship with the Boys & Girls Club.
