2013: A Year of Record Breaking Recruitment

Every January students return to campus refreshed from the holidays, anxious and excited to begin a new semester at Valparaiso University. For some it is a 'life as it was' before the break, but for others a return to campus marks the beginning of a life long journey as a sorority woman or a fraternity man.

This cycle of recruitment was a landmark year for both fraternities and sororities. The six National Panhellenic Conference chapters welcomed over **90 new women -** the **largest new member class in over a decade.** These incoming women hold high standards and have been challenged to continue to grow through their new affiliations; the average overall GPA for the Sorority new members was **3.369**.

However, January was not just a month to be celebrated amongst the women as our Fraternity men welcomed over **90 new members** to the fraternity community as well, effectively tying our women in membership for the semester. It is the plan for both the entire fraternity and sorority community to increase their numbers during formal recruitment as the incoming freshmen class continues to increase in size.


As value-based organizations we are proud of the work we have done this year and celebrate with one another our success!
