### Four Valpo Students Experience the **Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute**

Annually, hundreds of fraternity and sorority leaders from around North-America travel to Bloomington, Indiana for the Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute® (UIFI®), a program of the North-American Interfraternity Conference. This year, four Valpo students were able to participate due to scholarships from inter/national organizations and foundations.



(UIFI®) is a five day institute that brings together fraternity men and sorority women to create opportunities to explore, define, and enhance their leadership skills, personal awareness, commitment to their fraternity or sorority, and grow to expect values based action from themselves and those they lead. At UIFI®, participants are given the skills to improve their own leadership abilities and positively affect their chapter, council, and community.

Jeannette Paige, Panhellenic President, Will Prusinski of Lambda Chi Alpha, Austin Davis, the IFC Vice President of Operations and Ryan Acosta of Phi Kappa Psi all attended sessions of UIFI® this summer. Will Prisinski shared about his experience, "I felt a renewed commitment to my own organization and to fraternity and sorority life as a whole here at Valpo."

"Going into UIFI® I was anxious to see how a leadership program could influence over 80 fraternity and sorority members affiliated with many different organizations. UIFI will quickly shatter any myths or embellishments you have about fraternity and sorority life and give you the real, hard facts. UIFI hardwires into every participant a willingness to change for the better of his or her chapter, affiliation, and the community all together" stated Austin Davis.

It is clear that Zeta Iota has been working very hard in the last two years and has been recognized by the International Council and the International Sorority.

#### **Sharing the Good News**

At the annual Valparaiso University Fraternity and Sorority Awards Ceremony in May, the Valparaiso University Sexual Assault Awareness and Facilitative Education (SAAFE) Office recognized all 13 fraternity and sorority chapters with the SAAFE and Empowering Organization designation for 2013-2014.



Annually, fraternity and sorority members have the opportunity to participate in a number of educational programs and activities in an effort to educate the community about issues related to sexual assault, sexual assault prevention, bystander intervention, and personal wellness. In 2013-2014, more than 86% of the total members in fraternity and sorority life participated in SAAFE Office sponsored programs.

The culminating event is the annual "Valpo U Owns the Night" walk in April. Fraternities and sororities are eligible for the SAAFE and Empowering Organization designation by participating in a specific number of programs and educating their members on an annual basis.
