

The Indiana Iota chapter of Phi Delta Theta has had a great start to the 2015-2016 academic year. The men attended the Phi Delta Theta Kleberg Institute this summer in Oxford, Ohio where the chapter was recognized at the national level for the first time since their return to campus in 2012. The chapter was recognized in three areas including:

- The General Headquarters Trophy where Indiana Iota was one of 19 chapters to receive this honor, which is given to chapters that complete all GHQ requirements and are in good standing
- The Phi Delta Theta Scholarship Award
- The Biggers Ritual Award for outstanding ritual execution
