Valparaiso University Women's Empowerment Week 2018

During the last week of March, Valparaiso University celebrated Women's Empowerment Week that featured various events each night hosted by different women's organizations on campus. The week included events such as a Women's Voices Concert, a "Walk in Our Shoes" relay race, a Girl Scout STEM event, and a panel discussion of women who hold different leadership positions at the University.

The week was started by two members of Kappa Delta, Kate Weber and Katie Lahey. "We were talking about influential women on social media that provide posts and advice on how to uplift yourself and the people around you. Then, after chapter, Katie and I were talking about women's empowerment. That is when we started talking about how our campus seemed to lack a prominent stance on empowering women, and we wanted to provide something for that." Chapter Spotlight:

In February 2018, the Indiana Zeta RLC chapter of Sigma Phi Epsilon won the Excelsior Cup in Finance at the Sigma Phi Epsilon Carlson Leadership Academy.

The SigEp Carlson Leadership Academy is held every February in Chicago, Illinois for chapters in the Midwest. Carlson is a regional training academy for Sigma Phi Epsilon executive board officers, scholarship chairman, and rising leaders. Besides officer training, Carlson Academies will often feature presentations on new national legislation within the fraternity (like the substance free housing policy), and awards ceremonies that recognize chapters within that region for their achievements.



The Sigma Phi Epsilon Excelsior Cup is given to recognize outstanding improvement in an area of chapter management. For the Valpo SigEp chapter, the recognition was in the area of finance as a recognition of the chapters work on their chapter budget, re-allocation of funds from the chapter's formal to member education and recruitment, and the chapters substantial increase in collections to a near-perfect collections ratio.
