The men of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. hosted their first large scale philanthropy event in February with an inaugural Black Tie Gala. The tickets for the event were sold out well in advance of the event, and multiple representatives from fraternities and sororities were in attendance to support this new initiative. The event raised funds for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, which is the national philanthropic partner of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc.

In 2005, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. named St. Jude as its national philanthropic partner, and members began their fundraising efforts through regional golf tournaments to support lifesaving treatments of pediatric cancer, sickle cell disease, and other catastrophic illnesses. To date, members of Kappa Alpha Psi have raised more than \$2.5 million and are currently the top African American fundraising group for St. Jude.
