As soon as members came back from winter break, primary sorority recruitment began and lasted through the week until bid day on January 12, where all of the potential new members found their homes in their new sorority. Starting on January 8, fraternity recruitment began and lasted through January 24, when the official fraternity bid signing took place. We are so excited to welcome these new members into our FSL family.

On the sorority side, 2020 was the university's first primary recruitment with the addition of Alpha Gamma Delta! Sorority's went through the traditional primary recruitment, beginning with philanthropy night, then sisterhood night, and finally preference night.
