The leaves aren't the only things changing this Fall!

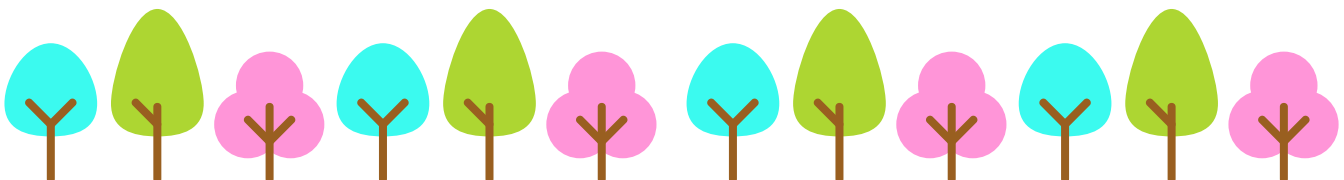
