## CYBERSECURITY TIPS FROM IT

### SPOT SCAM EMAILS

- The Message is sent from a public email domain rather than a Valpo account.
- The domain name is misspelled. For example: micros0ft.com
- The email is poorly written. Unnatural sentence structure and poor spelling are common.
- The email includes infected attachments. Always be suspicious of attachments and links!
- Suspicious links asking you to take action to protect an account you have.
- The message indicates a sense of urgency for you to complete a task or respond to the email.

### PROTECT PERSONAL INFORMATION

Always challenge unexpected requests for sensitive information. If you think it could be a scam, it probably is.

### PASSWORD PROTECTION

- Create strong passwords by using passcodes or phrases that contain both capital and lowercase letters, special characters and numbers.
- Never use personal passcodes at work.
- Always enable 2-factor authentication on your accounts.
- Never write down or share your passwords with others.

### PROTECT YOUR DEVICES

- Never ignore security updates. They can contain important software updates that address known vulnerabilities.
- Always lock your device when you are not using it and require security settings to log back into the device.

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## CYBERSECURITY TRAINING

Earlier this month the Office of Information Technology announced mandatory cybersecurity training for all faculty and staff. This is needed in order to maintain our compliance with insurance compliance, and various legal and contractual obligations.

We've configured the program so that it's broken into 3 smaller segments that should take no more than an hour total to complete. Our training will begin on Monday, October 9, 2023 and you will have until December 1, 2023 to complete the first course, *How to Protect Yourself Against Phishing Attacks*. The additional courses will be made available starting in the beginning of January. We hope that by dividing these courses, it will make them easier to complete in smaller blocks of time.
