

## Sentence Structures

- **Subject + verb + article + noun**

*Tu as une pomme. / Marc a une orange.*

- **Article + noun + verb + adverb + adjective**

*La pomme est très bonne. (note agreement with noun)*

- **Subject + verb + article + noun + adjective**

*Je mange une pomme rouge.*

- **Subject + pronoun\* (COD, COI) + verb**

\* Pronouns: me, te, se, nous, vous, le, la, les, l', lui, leur, y, en  
More details about pronoun order are found on another tip sheet.

*Elle vous invite. (She invites you.)*

*Je lui ai donné le livre. (I gave the book to him.)*

- **Negative sentences**

Put **ne** between the subject and the verb & **pas** after the first verb if there are two verbs.  
If it's **passé composé**, a two-part verb, put it after the 1st part of the verb—the auxiliary.

**Passé composé**

*Je n'ai pas aimé le film. (I didn't like the film.)*

**Two verbs**

*Je ne peux pas sortir (I can't go out.)*

*Je n'ai pas visité la France. (I didn't visit France.)*

- **Questions**

**Yes—No question** = Est-ce que + subject + verb + . . .

*Est-ce que tu étudies le chinois?*

Or, using inversion: *Étudies-tu le chinois?*

**Content question** = Question word (qui, quand, où, que, pourquoi, comment) + est-ce que + subject + verb + . . .

*Quand est-ce que Marc arrive ce week-end?*



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*Quand est-ce que Marc arrive ce week-end?*
