IV. COURSES TAUGHT AND OTHER ACADEMIC RESPONSIBILITIES

- (A) Sports Law 2004
This Fall will be my first time teaching Sports Law.
- (B) International Sports Law – Seminar 2004
This Fall will be my first time teaching International Sports Law.
- (C) Advanced Appellate Advocacy – Civil 2005
This spring will be my first time teaching Advanced Appellate Advocacy.

- (E) Legal Writing 1985 – 2003.

Over the past seventeen years, the structure and particulars of the school's legal writing program has changed approximately three times. The most recent incarnation of the program divides the course into two semesters and employs the titles Legal Writing and Reasoning I and Legal Writing and Reasoning II.

- (F) International Law, 1996-2003.

This class focuses on the rules governing relations between nation-states and individual citizens. The subjects that I cover include the sources of international law, the operations of the United Nations, law of the sea, the force of international law in the U.S. courts, and the use of force.

- (G) International Business Transactions, 1987-2004.

This class is designed to cover the basics of a cross board business transaction. We start with basic international economic principles and then explore the institutions that regulate international economic activity. We then cover the details of cross boarder sales of goods transactions (which consumes the majority of the semester) and finish with some material on protecting intellectual property abroad.

- (H) ASP Preparation Course, 1990 - 2002

(I) Second Year Writing Requirement.

1993-1994

Each student was required to write two papers. The first paper was a memo exploring an issue in space law such as the military use of space. The second paper was a persuasive piece on that subject. I required and critiqued a rough draft of each paper.

1992-1993

Each of my students was required to write two papers of at least five pages. The first paper was an office memo evaluating an issue or defense raised in the prosecution of General Manuel Antonio Noriega. The second paper was an argument to the Court of Appeals on the issue evaluated in the students' first paper. I required and critiqued a rough draft of each paper.

1991-1992

Similar to the plan used in 1992-1993, I required two papers of at least five pages from each student. The first paper was a research paper on the precedential value of foreign court decisions in United States' courts. The second paper was a court memo that relied upon a foreign court decision as authority. I required and critiqued a rough draft of each paper.
