Do you need to file a tax return?

Please refer to IRS.gov for more specific filing requirements, but typically you must file if:

- You are married and your combined gross income is more than \$25,900 (if filing separate: must file with income over \$5)
- You are single (with a dependent-filing as head of household) and gross income is more than \$19,400
- You are single (and parents claim you on their tax return) and earned income is more than \$12,950
- You are single (and parents cannot claim you on their tax return) and gross income is more than \$12,950

Self-employed individuals are required to file an annual return and pay estimated tax quarterly if they had net earnings from self-employment of \$400 or more.

Failing to file a required federal income tax return, will prevent the disbursement of federal student aid. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) requires income and tax information from the prior prior year.

Requesting a Wage and Income Tax Transcript from the IRS (online):

- 2. Choose the **Get Transcript Online** option.
- 3. Sign in with an existing account or create a new account utilizing the options provided by the IRS.
- 4. Once logged in, select **Higher Education/Student Aid** from the drop-down menu and click **Go**. You do not need to enter a customer file number to make the request.
- 5. Make sure to request Wage and Income Transcript.
- 6. Please ensure you enter the tax year requested on your verification form.

Requesting via telephone is also available from the IRS by calling 1.800.908.9946 and may take 5 to 10 business days. Mail request can also be made and instructions are available at IRS.gov.

Requesting an IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter (Online)

- 1. Click the **Get your Tax Record** link on the home page.
- 2. Choose the **Get Transcript Online** option.
- 3. Sign in with an existing account or create a new account utilizing the options provided by the IRS.
- 4. Once logged in, select **Higher Education/Student Aid** from the drop-down menu and click **Go**. You do not need to enter a customer file number to make the request.
- 5. Select Verification of Non-filing Letter and enter the tax year requested on your verification form.
- 6. If successfully validated, you will be able to view your IRS Verification of Non-filing Letter that can be printed.
