 - ii. Operating pressures: teach out of law school; decline in graduate enrollment; demographic challenges (national/midwest trend data); family income and affordability; investments in new programs; investments in marketing initiatives; attract and retain talented faculty and staff

 - v. Has endowment spending gone up each year?
 - 1. The past 3 years, yes
 - 2. Grew 4% last year even with additional spend
 - vi. How can we increase transparency?
 - 1. Every year, required to public finances on EMMA Bond Disclosure; will see the data. Public information
 - 2. Present to faculty and staff every month
 - vii. Ideas: an email, a forum
 - viii. Are stricter residency requirements (increase to 6 semesters) trying to get money out of students for room & board?
 1. Yes
 - ix. Cutting December Commencement Ceremony- a financial decision?1. Yes
